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Animal Tissues- In animals different types of tissues are found to perform different functions.

1. Epithelial Tissue (Epithelium)- Epithelial tissue is the protective tissue of the animal body (as epidermis). They cover most organs and cavity in the body like lining of buccal cavity, blood vessels, alveoli, kidney tubules etc.

Functions-

- * They protect inner cells from drying, injury, chemical effect, viral or bacterial infection.
- * Helps in absorption of water and nutrients.
- * Helps in elimination of waste products.
- * Some tissues help in secretion like sweat, saliva, enzymes etc.

Types of epithelial tissue-

- (i) Squamous Epithelium-
 - * Forms lining of cavity of mouth, oesophagus, nose alveoli and blood vessels, covering of tongue and skin.
 - * It protects from mechanical injury, entry of germs, chemical and drying.

(ii) Stratified Squamous epithelium-

- * It covers external surface of skin
- * This epithelium is water- proof and protect from mechanical injury.

(iii) Cuboidal Epithelium-

- * Cube like cells found in kidney tubules, thyroid vesicles, salivary and sweat glands.
- * Helps in absorption, excretion and secretion.

(iv) Columnar epithelium-

- * Pillar-like, It forms lining of stomach, small intestine and colon, gall bladder, oviducts etc.
- * Helps in absorption and secretion (mucus).

(v) Glandular Epithelium-

- *These epithelium tissues form glands which secrete chemicals.
- (vi)Ciliated Epithelium- Certain cuboidal or columnar cells have thread like outgrowths, called cilia. These cells form ciliated epithelium.
 - * Found in trachea, bronchi, kidney tubules and oviducts.
 - * Helps to move solid particles in one direction.

2. Muscular Tissues-

* Muscular tissues form contractile tissues like muscular tissue of Limbs, Heart etc.

Types:-

(i) Striated muscles-

- * These are also known as striped, skeletal or voluntary muscles.
- * These muscle fibres have dark and light stripes.
- * Helps in locomotion and other voluntary movements.

(ii) Smooth Muscles-

- * These are also known as unstriated, visceral or involuntary muscles.
- * Helps in involuntary movement like peristaltic movements in gastrointestinal tract, male genital tract, uterus, gall bladder etc.

(iii) Cardiac muscles-

- * Cardiac muscles are involuntary.
- * Cardiac muscle cells are cylindrical, branched and uninucleate.
- * Cardiac muscles can contract and relax rapidly and tirelessly throughout a life time like heart.

* Heart muscles help to pump blood and distribute blood to various part of the body.

3. Connective tissue-

* These are specialized to connect various body organs like blood, ligaments, nerves etc..

Types:-

- (i) Areolar or Loose connective Tissue
- (ii) Dense connective Tissue
- (iii) Adipose Tissue (e.g Fat Cells)
- (iv) Skeletal Tissue (Skeleton)
- (v) Fluid connective Tissue (Blood and Lymph)

4. Nervous Tissue-

- * Nervous tissues are specialized to transmit messages within our body.
- * Brain, spinal cord and nerves are all composed of nervous tissues.
- * These tissues are formed by nerve cells or neuron.
