- (a) Mr. Suri collects Rs. 59,99,999 as funds for a trust. He spends Rs. 42,00,121 to build a hospital and Rs. 1,78,645 to buy equipment for the hospital. What amount is he left with?

Solu : Total amount = 59,99,999
Spend to build hospital = 42,00,121
Purchase equipment = 1,78,645
Total amount spend = 42,00,121 + 1,78,645 = 43,78,766
Amount left = 59,99,999 – 43,78,766 = 16,21,233

- (b) Light travels at a speed of 29,97,92,458 meters per second. If a ray of light has already travelled 10,19,99,798 meters, how much distance is left for it to travel in that second?

Solu : Speed of light (per sec) = 29,97,92,458
Already travelled = 10,19,99,798
Distance left = 29,97,92,458 – 10,19,99,798 = 19,77,92,660m

- (c) A biscuit factory places an order for 10,34,567 kg of flour in a month. Out of this, 3,47,98,000 g is corn flour, 7,89,24,000 g is maize flour, 16,54,10,000 g is oat flour and the remaining is whole wheat flour. How much wheat flour does the biscuit factory order?

Solu : Total flour = 10,34,567 kg
Corn flour = 3,47,98,000g Convert into (kg) = 3,47,98,000 ÷ 1000 = 34,798kg
Maize flour = 7,89,24,000g Convert into (kg) = 7,89,24,000 ÷ 1000 = 78,924kg
Oat flour = 16,54,10,000g Convert into (kg) = 16,54,10,000 ÷ 1000 = 1,65,410kg
Total = 34,798 + 78,924 + 1,65,410 = 2,79,133
Wheat flour = 10,34,567 – 2,79,133 = 7,55,434kg
